



## What We Do

### 2018-2019 Income \$277,824




## By the Numbers 2019

## Who Are We?

We're the Interfaith Homeless Emergency Lodging Program—operated by Outreach Unlimited a nonprofit 501(c) (3).

I-HELP is run by a volunteer board of directors and a part-time staff, with the indispensable collaboration of over 60 Monterey-area congregations, faith communities, and service organizations that provide, on a rotating basis, overnight accommodation, warm meals, and person-to-person support.

We collaborate with other agencies such as Salvation Army, Gathering for Women, Veterans Transition Center and Vets Housing, Interim, Central Coast Center for Independent Living, and the One Starfish Program.

## How We Do It

We accept applications from unhoused people. We expect the applicants to be sober, get along with others, and follow directions. There is a 2-3 day trial period where the coordinators and monitors evaluate the applicant.

Every effort is made to help each person be successful. We do this by helping each participant to set goals for health care, work or income/benefits and housing.

Our overnight monitors provide help in adjusting to group living. Our shelter coordinators provide management expertise to shelter operations as well as case management. Our bus drivers all hold class B licenses enabling them to operate our coaches donated by MST and maintained by us. Both drivers and monitors often have been in our program. All of the above staff are paid modest wages.
